AN ACT

Appropriating for the operating and capital expenses of all departments, offices and agencies of state government; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. The sum of \$292,104,000 is hereby appropriated from the general fund and from the unreserved special accounts in the general fund for the periods specified, to be apportioned according to the schedules in secs. 7, 8 and 9 of this Act.

* Sec. 11. If federal program receipts or other program recelpts exceed the estimates appropriated by this Act and are appropriated to the affected program, the appropriation from state funds for the affected program shall be reduced by the amount of the excess provided the reductions are not inconsistent with applicable federal statutes. However, if the program receipts, other than federal receipts, support programs that provide services for all state agencies, they may be made available for expenditure by a budget amendment approved by the governor and the Legislative Budget amendments allowed by this section to the Second Session of the Seventh Legislature.

* Sec. 12. If federal program receipts or other program receipts not appropriated by this Act and not requiring state matching money are received by a department, office or agency of the state during the fiscal period covered by this Act, they may be appropriated and made available for expenditure by a budget amendment approved by the governor and the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee. The governor shall report the budget amendments allowed under this section to the First Session of the Eighth Legislature.

* Sec. 13. If federal program receipts or other program receipts fall short of the estimates appropriated by this Act, the governor shall reduce the affected appropriation by the amount of the short fall in receipts.

* Sec. 14. Adjustments may be made in the appropriations from a working capital fund for the fiscal period covered by this Act, when necessitated by changes in requirements for services and supplies. The adjustments shall be approved by the governor and the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee.

* Sec. 15. (a) If the amount required under applicable statutes for refunds of shared taxes and revenues to eligible political subdivisions exceeds the estimates appropriated by this Act, the excess is appropriated.

(b) Refunds may be made in the manner prescribed by law from any fund in any amount due. .

* Sec. 16. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.

FREE CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORT FCCSSCSCSHB NO. 58

This report reflects the intent of the Free Conference Committee on HOUSE BILL NO. 58 and the significant decisions of the committee relative to the appropriations for the various state agencies.

OPERATING BUDGET

GENERAL GOVERNMENT

OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

<u>Planning and Research</u>. The committee included \$50,000 for a study of income needs of the aged.

Local Affairs. Funds were increased for state participation in OEO programs.

<u>Rural Development</u>. Headstart Child Development Program, public works projects under AS 44.19.610(3), are funded at \$50,000.

Boards and Commissions. The committee has added \$2,200 for reimbursement for the Bartlett statue pedestal.

<u>Contingency Fund</u>. An additional \$100,000 has been included for pipeline information expenditures.

DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION

<u>Municipal Services Revenue Sharing</u>. The committee added \$600,000 to the Revenue Sharing account for state aid to hospitals, health facilities, and services as provided in SENATE BILL NO. 42.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

Audit. The committee provided funding for three new field agents.

<u>Motor Vehicle</u>. The reduction in this division anticipates \$100,000 in savings through use of license plate tabs for an additional year rather than issue new plates.

<u>Treasury</u>. This division was reduced by \$150,000 (the Governor's proposed enrichment of the investment program); this is partially offset by the addition of \$50,000 for a Mortgage Loan Officer and related staff, supplies and equipment.

LEGISLATURE

Legislative Council -- Legislature. The amount appropriated for the Legislature includes legislative salaries (\$632,900), 90 days session help (\$337,800), 94 days legislative per diem and round trip session travel (\$209,400) and legislative expense allowances (\$240,000).

Legislative Budget and Audit Committee. This budget was funded as requested, with the addition of \$50,000 in contractual audit services and \$125,900 in funding for the new Legislative Finance Division (all positions in Legislative Finance are currently funded in Legislative Affairs).

EDUCATION

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

<u>Administration -- Scholarship Loans</u>. No portion of this appropriation shall be used for the payment of grants to students or as payment for services rendered under contractual agreements with privately sponsored institutions of higher education.

Educational Broadcasting Commission. This appropriation includes \$627,000 for the lower Kuskokwim/Yukon educational TV network and \$50,000 for construction of a radio station in Kotzebue.

<u>District School Support -- Debt Service</u>. The committee included funds for cash payment reimbursement under SENATE BILL NO. 15.

<u>Foundation Program</u>. The appropriation for the foundation program may be underfunded. In such case, all districts able to substantiate additional support requirements will be fully funded in a supplemental appropriation.

Libraries. It is the intent of the committee that the following two projects shall be accomplished within the approved appropriation, without resort to a supplemental appropriation: the indexing of governmental and other publications on Alaska (as proposed in HB 356 and HCR 29); and the indexing of microfilm and translation of historical documents pertinent to the Russian period in Alaskan history (as proposed in HB 329).

STATE OPERATED SCHOOLS.

<u>Area Schools</u>. The appropriation for Area Schools includes funding for increased payments to Alaska Village Electrification Cooperative; and for the operation and maintenance of the Gakona school.

UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA

The appropriation for the University includes funds to cover faculty and employee salary increases.

HEALTH AND WELFARE

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE

Administration -- Office of the Commissioner. The committee did not allow the second deputy director and related costs requested.

<u>Public Welfare -- Administration</u>. The Clerk Typist II shall be reinstated in the Nome office.



SENATE AND HOUSE JOURNAL SUPPLEMENT

Aid to Families with Dependent Children. This appropriation includes \$200,000 for Operation Upgrade.

Food Stamp Program. The Eligibility Worker II positions shall be reinstated (one each) in the Nome office and the Kotzebue office.

Public Health -- Community Health. The committee added \$200,000 for the Anchorage Borough Health Department (for a total of \$360,000), and restored the other grants to their current level.

Office of Alcoholism. The committee included \$250,000 additional funding for grants to detoxification centers.

<u>Child Health Service</u>. The committee provided for a new position of Public Health Nurse II in Wrangell and the reinstatement of the Public Health Nurse II in Bethel. The committee also added \$125,000 to grants for the Alaska Methodist University nursing program (\$175,000 total).

<u>Corrections</u>. No decreases from the Governor's allowance were made in contractual services, commodities or equipment.

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS

<u>General Program</u>. This program includes the \$500,000, as requested by the Governor, for this new department and funds transferred from Environmental Health, General Program. Also included within this funding is a Sanitarian II for the Kenai and Drift River oil tanker loading facilities to check compliance with state laws regarding ballast loading and discharge.

REGULATION

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

<u>Occupational Licensing</u>. The committee included \$60,000 to fund testing of automatic pipeline welding processes.

PUBLIC PROTECTION

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

<u>Division of Technical Services</u>. The appropriation for this division includes the state matching of \$97,300 for the Criminal Justice Information System (matched 60/40, federal/state, under the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968).

CONSERVATION, NATURAL RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT

DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

Land Management. The committee added \$20,000 in contractual services for water table research in the Kenny Lake Soil Conservation District.

<u>Cadastral Engineering</u>. This appropriation includes \$100,000 for the North Tee Harbor subdivision access road.

<u>Oil and Gas Division</u>. The position of Petroleum Reservoir Engineer shall be reinstated with the additional funds that were included for this purpose. Loan Fund Capital. The Department of Revenue shall give serious consideration to the purchase of mortgages and notes made under the Alaska Agriculture Loan Act.

DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

No. 5

<u>Administration</u>. The committee included \$10,000 in support of Zoological education programs in the Anchorage Area.

Commercial Fisheries -- Research. The AYK Region Whitefish Research Program was funded at \$37,400.

<u>Sport Fish</u>. The requested "special programs" were disallowed; in their place a sport fish stocking program was authorized.

<u>Protection</u>. This budget includes funding for seven parttime protection officers: two in southeast, two in Cook Inlet, two in Prince William Sound and one in Kodiak. It also includes funds for a 25 foot or longer enforcement vessel and an additional protection officer for enforcement work, both to be stationed in the Cook Inlet area.

Stream Rehabilitation Program. This funds the Governor's revised requested program plus the inclusion of \$1,000 in stream rehabilitation funds for Chester Creek in the Anchorage area.

TRANSPORTATION, COMMUNICATIONS AND BUILDING SERVICES

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

Buildings -- Director's Office. The committee authorized a new position of Deputy Director.

<u>Maintenance</u>. Since the scheduled transfer of 15 BIA schools to the state system on July 1 is no longer anticipated, inter-agency receipts were decreased accordingly.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION

The capital improvement appropriations made to the Department of Administration (for Erskine House, Kodiak; Urban Renewal Project, North Star Borough; Water Project, Bethel; and St. Michael's Cathedral Fund, Sitka) shall be paid as grants to the named agencies.

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The capital improvement appropriation made to the Department of Economic Development for municipal, civic convention, and community recreation center planning shall be paid as grants to the appropriate local government (HB 119).

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

The capital improvement appropriation made for water and harbor projects, boat launching ramps is to include facilities at Big Delta.
