Agency Response

On January 6, 2025, the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation (AGDC) announced they entered into an exclusive framework agreement with a private entity for the development of the Alaska LNG project, including the Alaska LNG export facility in Nikiski, and a pipeline and carbon capture facility on the North Slope. It was revealed that Glenfarne Group, LLC is the investor. Glenfarne Group is a developer, owner, operator, and industrial manager of energy and infrastructure assets across the Americas, Asia and Europe. AGDC is working with Glenfarne on the specifics of the framework agreement and to create a legally binding development agreement

Agency Response

The federal Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program of award of \$1,017.1 was received on October 21, 2023, amended and countersigned on December 13, 2023. The award will be received by the State on a cost reimbursable basis. The distribution mechanism for the Alaska Broadband Grant Program has been established and began soliciting applications on December 16, 2024. Applications are due April 14, 2025. The Alaska Broadband Office (ABO) will then take 90 days to evaluate the applications and select preliminary grantees. The ABO will then work with the National Telecommunications and Information Association (NTIA) to finalize the selections. This finalization is estimated to take three months with Alaska Broadband Grant Program announcements estimated in the early fourth quarter. As reported in the five-year action plan, the ABO expects that the Alaska Broadband Grant Program will use all of the available technologies (fiber, microwave, wi-fi, and satellite) to reach 100% of the unserved (and potential the underserved) locations in Alaska.
