Specialized teams of prosecutors and paralegals with the responsibility of handling these cases will remove the competition for resources that presently exists and will eventually result in communities that are safer for these victims. This project will provide for specialized units in Alaska's busiest district attorney offices to focus solely on sexual assault/domestic violence cases - both those where the victim is an adult as well as the many in which a child is victimized. These cases will then receive the prosecutorial expertise and resource commitment that is necessary to insure consistent vigorous prosecution and appropriate attention to victim's rights and needs. Additional authority is requested to receive and expend \$639.3 in federal funds granted from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. Alaska is by far the largest of the states in geographical size with distances and obstacles to travel that are substantial and unique. Outside of Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau, the population of Alaska largely resides in literally hundreds of small towns and villages spread throughout a vast geographical area. Rural Alaska has special law enforcement needs that derive from its geographical size and the isolation of most of its rural communities where alcohol is the root of most criminal problems. While the effort to cut off alcohol availablility is underway, the intent of this proposal would be to aggressively prosecute crimes resulting from that availability, thus attacking the problem from two fronts. A special unit or team of prosecutors and paraprofessionals that would be available to provide assistance and support to the rural prosecution effort could have a significant positive impact on prosecutions in rural Alaska and, ultimately, reduce the level of crime in these communities.

This project will provide a flexible prosecution team available to provide back-up and assistance all over rural Alaska on an as needed basis. This team would consist of three prosecutors, a paralegal and a secretary in an office located in Anchorage. The prosecutors and paralegal would provide support to rural offices throughout the state and be available to travel to any rural office when necessary. In addition, this rural prosecution team would be responsible for providing advice, conducting training and developing policy specifically intended to more effectively deliver services to rural Alaska.

Due to the economic recession and plummeting stock markets, the Trust has decreased its financial projections for FY2010 since original budget approval in September 2008. MH Trust: Dis Justice - Deliver training for prosecutors statewide to understand and effectively handle legal cases involving persons with mental health disorders and/or cognitive impairments.

This project maintains a critical component of the Disability Justice Focus Area by providing foundational knowledge on mental health disorders and cognitive impairments, best-practice and available treatment, and our state's community behavioral health system. These legal professionals typically have received little or no training in these areas, yet a significant percentage of individuals they interact with professionally experience mental health disorders and/or cognitive impairments. By providing this training and education these legal professionals are better equipped to understand the needs of Trust beneficiaries, to consider underlying causes for a beneficiary's contact with the criminal justice system, and to set appropriate conditions of bail/probation given the individual's mental and/or cognitive capacity, thus minimizing the risk of future costs associated with incarceration and the processing of another criminal case as a result of bail/probation violations.

In 2002, under a legislative mandate, the collections unit began collecting and distributing restitution owed to victims in criminal cases. The caseload and backlog is increasing dramatically: In 2002, the adult restitution active caseload was 800; by 2010 this rose to over 6,500. The staffing shortage also negatively affects the unit's ability to send money to victims. Over 11,000 payments are collected but not disbursed. Some payments due to victims are are more than two years old. New cases have not been opened, impacting garnishment of the 2010 PFD in those cases. Current restitution staff consists of one paralegal and two office assistants, plus the original funding first appropriated for this purpose in 2002. In addition to this base increment request (Anchorage Paralegal I, PFT 03-#019 and funding), the department is also requesting a multi-year FY2011 supplemental appropriation of \$750.0 and three non-permanent positions to help significantly reduce or eliminate the backlog in collections from offenders and payments to victims.

Statutory Designated Program Receipts (SDPR) for the Consumer Protection unit is on the downswing due to the absence of large-dollar consumer protection / antitrust cases on the horizon. In recent years, this area of the budget has increasingly relied on SDPR as general funds have been reduced. Sufficient receipts exist through FY05, but our projections indicate that FY06 will be short funded. Total authorization from this fund source is \$636,900.

\$680,381 is currently available, down from \$1,000,000 available at the beginning of FY04. We anticipate additional collections this year of \$230,000 - \$300,000. The Department currently has four measures focused on consumer protection and aimed specifically at increasing consumer education, strengthening consumer protection legislation and regulations, effectively enforcing consumer laws and regulations, and reducing unfair methods of competition. As an example of new efforts underway in Consumer Protection, effective September 1, 2004, charitable organizations wishing to do business in the State of Alaska began paying a registration fee. That fee will in part help fund monitoring of that requirement and is included in estimated receipts that will be collected and

For example, in fiscal year 2006, the Consumer Protection attorneys secured in excess of \$500,000 in Statutory Designated Program receipts (SDPR) money for the state from Consumer Protection/Antitrust multi-state settlements. So far in fiscal year 2007, the Consumer Protection attorneys have helped secure almost \$700,000

The Child Protection Section seeks to add two paralegals, one each in Palmer and Kenai. Presently, in each of those locations, one attorney is handling the entire child protection caseload, and in both instances the caseload is far above the recommended 100 cases per attorney, with 160 in Palmer and 196 in Kenai. The Palmer office will soon add a second attorney as a result of the passage of SB237 in the last legislative session that adds new judges around the state, including two in Palmer and one in Kenai. This means that cases will be moving through the judicial system much more quickly. Attorneys doing child protection work in both locations will greatly benefit from additional paralegal support. Paralegals are generally responsible for obtaining often voluminous case files for the Office of Children's Services, purging those files of confidential information, and providing copies as discovery to the other parties to the case; reviewing OCS files to prepare exhibit lists and motions for records; arranging for subpoenas for witnesses; preparing pre-trial notebooks; contacting and interviewing witnesses; scheduling witnesses for trial; preparing routine motions and responses to motions; and trial support. Without paralegal support, these tasks fall to the attorneys and detract from preparation for court. Two additional paralegals and funding, one each for Kenai and Palmer are requested.

In addition, funding from Law's fiscal note for SB237 will allow this section to add an additional PPT Law Office Assistant in Palmer.

Law (DOL) requests an appropriation for FY2011 in the amount of \$4.0 million to continue the pending litigation seeking penalties and lost revenues for the 2006 Prudhoe Bay pipeline spills and production shutdowns. The State filed its complaint in Superior Court on March 31, 2009, seeking recovery of lost revenues for 2006-08 due to curtailments of oil production stemming from BPXA's negligent corrosion practices. The case is being hotly contested.

FY2011 is a critical year for the litigation. The jury trial is scheduled for September 2011. The bulk of the discovery and post discovery pre-trial work will occur in FY2011 under the Pretrial Order entered by Judge Michalski in August. For the discovery phase, this means offensive and defensive discovery; discovery and dispositive motion practice; third party discovery; depositions (BPXA estimates over a hundred depositions will be required); and expert work, expert reports and expert depositions. The post discovery pre-trial phase will include dispositive motion practice, motions in limine, trial preparation, witness testimony preparation, exhibits, demonstrative exhibits, and designation of deposition testimony.
